Research Activities: The focus of this intervention was to teach students how to use a graphic organizer as a tool to provide structure and organization while writing a problem and solution essay, a genre of writing required by the California Content Standards for sixth grade. Context: This intervention took place in a 6th grade, self-contained classroom with 29 students. Methods and Data: The intervention spanned three consecutive weeks and took 14 days to implement.
